

Contact Dermatitis

Residents Course | 27-29 November 2024 | Coimbra, Portugal

Description

The Course on contact dermatitis will be a comprehensive course to make dermatology residents aware of the pathophysiology and clinical presentations of contact hypersensitivity reactions, mostly allergic contact dermatitis, photoallergic contact dermatitis and immediate contact reactions and to train them on the best techniques to perform their etiological diagnosis. Skin testing will be revisited with particular emphasis on the methodology of patch testing, the reading and interpretation of positive reactions and patient orientation.

There will be a comprehensive overview of the main allergens that are part of the European Baseline series and the main settings where they cause cutaneous reactions and practical aspects on how to manage the more frequent localizations of contact reactions (facial dermatitis, hand eczema, generalized dermatitis), from the diagnosis, skin testing and treatment.

There will be a practical part where regular patients from the clinic will be observed and examples on how to collect the history, choose allergens to test apart from the European Baseline series, read and interpret skin test reactions and how to advise the patient concerning allergen avoidance.

Residents are requested to prepare and present a case report to share with the other participants and the Faculty. The best presentations will be awarded a prize.

This event presents a valuable networking opportunity, allowing attendees to connect with residents from different settings and share cases on contact dermatitis with specialists in the field.

Learning Objectives

- 1. Recognize the main clinical presentations of contact hypersensitivity reactions and understand the underlying pathophysiology.
- 2. Become familiar with the methodology of skin testing, particularly patch testing, and the reading and interpretation of the reactions.
- 3. Know how to manage the most frequent eczema localizations that search contact dermatitis clinics.
