

Genital Dermatology and Genital Infections

Residents and Specialists Course | 13-14 November 2024 | Bucharest, Romania

Description

The course will blend theoretical lectures with practical sessions. Renowned clinicians will share their expertise in diagnosing dermato-venereological diseases presenting with genital symptoms. Participants will learn how recent Mpox outbreaks and new epidemiological findings are influencing patient management for genital lesions. They will improve their proficiency in managing genital diseases, from taking patient histories and conducting laboratory tests to interpreting microbiological data.

Clinical cases presented by both lecturers and participants will be thoroughly analyzed. Discussions will encompass prevention strategies, pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP), post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), and antimicrobial resistance.

Upon completing the course, participants will be equipped to recommend suitable diagnostic and therapeutic approaches for prevalent genital dermatoses, including infectious conditions.

Learning Objectives

1. Analyze the latest STI epidemiological data in the context of the WHO strategy to fight STIs
2. Illustrate the diversity of genital lesions, venereal and non-venereal.
3. Appreciate that technical progress related to the laboratory diagnosis
4. Demonstrate the importance of prevention measures in fighting sexually transmitted infections (STI).
5. Understand the PrEP and PEP advantages and risks
6. Discuss antibiotic resistance related to STI treatment
