

Hidradenitis suppurativa Current status and developments

Combined Course (Residents + Specialists) | 2-3 February 2026 | Valletta, Malta

Description

Hidradenitis suppurativa / acne inversa (HS) is a chronic, inflammatory, recurrent, painful, debilitating skin disease affecting terminal hair follicles that are usually presents after puberty. This disease is characterized by painful, deep-seated, inflamed lesions in the apocrine gland-bearing areas of the body, most commonly in the axillary, inframammary, and perineal regions and can recur periodically in almost any body area (Dessauer definition, 2006). Although a significant amount of research has taken place in the last 20 years, its etiology remains unknown.

Up to shortly HS was an "orphan" disease with a large variant of diagnostic terms, unsystematic treatment and an uncontrolled course that frustrated the patients. In the meantime, pathogenetic concepts, definition, diagnostic criteria, patients' registry, dynamic severity score assessment and treatment guidelines have been established, especially in Europe. Due to its occurrence exclusively in the skin, HS is a dermatological disorder, and other specialties recognize in the meantime that this disease has to be treated by dermatologists. Therefore, the education of European dermatologists on the rapidly emerging developments and the conservative and surgical options of treatment is urgently required.

The disease is nowadays considered to be common; it is estimated that 1% of the general population is affected and this percentage varies by geographic region. HS has a considerable impact of the quality of life; the mean Dermatology Life Quality Index (DLQI) of sufferers is higher than of sufferers from any other skin disorder. New drugs based on molecular scientific aspects of HS etiology are developed or are under development and the increase of HS knowledge requires modern research procedures.
