Under the steadfast guidance of the Executive Committee (EC), EADV has witnessed significant advancements. Notable among them is the appointment of Prof Carle Paul as the JEADV editor, the successful implementation of a new workflow system and the unveiling of a renewed design for the Academy's Journal. Twenty twenty four was also a landmark year for our sister journal, JEADV Clinical Practice (JEACP), under the leadership of Dr. Antonio Torrelo. The substantial increase in submissions

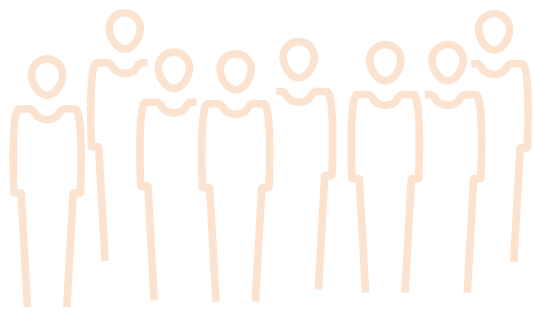
reflects the growing recognition of JEACP as an attractive platform, reaffirming its upward trajectory.

Our esteemed Scientific Programming Committee has continued to develop world-class programmes that inspire and engage. With a focus on groundbreaking developments in translational dermatology, advanced treatment strategies and emerging patient care methodologies, the committee masterfully balances the imperative of reinforcing core knowledge while embracing the latest clinical innovations.

The resounding success of the Spring Symposium in Malta and the 33rd Amsterdam Congress, in the Netherlands, both of which saw record-breaking attendance, stands as a testament to their work. In Amsterdam, we welcomed 13,000 health professionals.

EADV remains deeply committed to education, having organised a wide array of successful face-to-face courses across Europe and beyond. These sessions covered critical clinical topics and drew participants





from across the globe, including Egypt, Brazil, Morocco, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Singapore. New courses, such as therapeutics in hair loss and hair transplant, confocal microscopy and supportive onco-dermatology, have expanded our educational reach and impact.

Beyond in-person engagements, the Academy has enriched our digital learning offerings. Over 200 hours of on-demand content, including online courses, webcasts, and more than 120 expert-led podcasts, have been made available to our members. Looking ahead, we anticipate the addition of Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits to all existing materials on our learning platform, further enhancing professional development opportunities.

As an organisation, we recognise our responsibility to safeguard the environment and to ensure our events are sustainable and headed towards being CO₂-neutral. To spearhead this crucial initiative, we have partnered with AIM Group International, a distinguished organisation renowned for its expertise in sustainable event management. Their strategic approach, detailed roadmap and extensive experience position EADV on a transformative path toward sustainability, marking a pivotal milestone in our Academy's history.

Furthermore, in a significant development, our advocacy efforts have been unified under a single task force,

bringing together the Advocacy Working Group and the Patient Advocacy Task Force. While each maintains distinct objectives, both share the common mission of championing patient needs. To strengthen our influence, we have enlisted the support of ACUMEN, a company specialised in bridging the gap between medical societies and policymakers. This collaboration aims to amplify political awareness and secure essential support for patients with skin diseases.

As we reflect on the achievements of 2024, we stand resolute in our mission to advance dermatology, foster education and advocate for patient care. United in purpose and driven by innovation, we look forward to an even brighter future for the Academy and the global dermatology community.

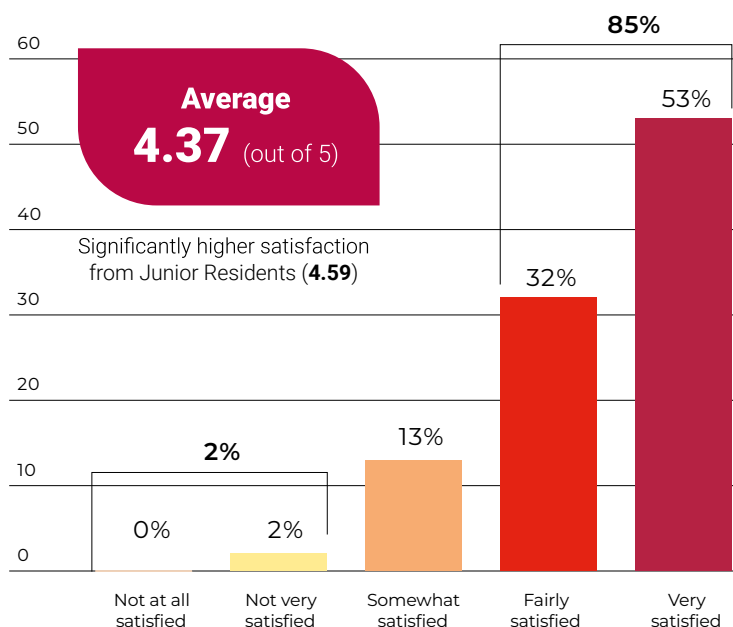
By providing access to cutting-edge resources, fostering collaboration and supporting professional growth, EADV empowers our members to make a lasting impact on the future of dermatology and venereology.

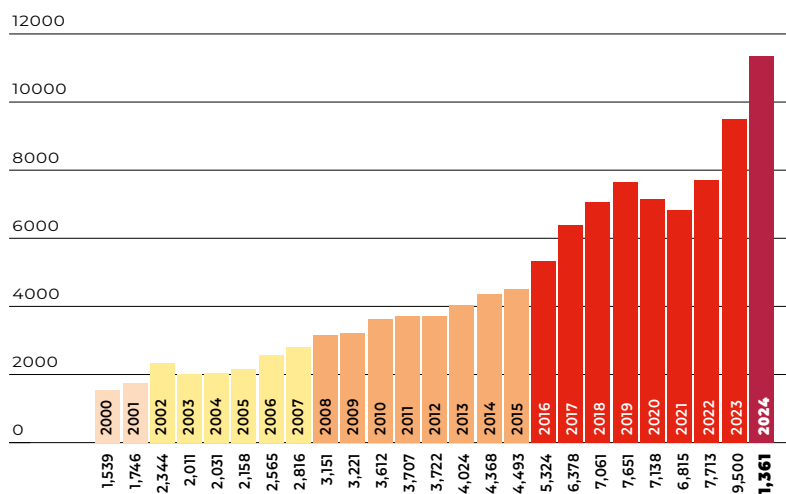

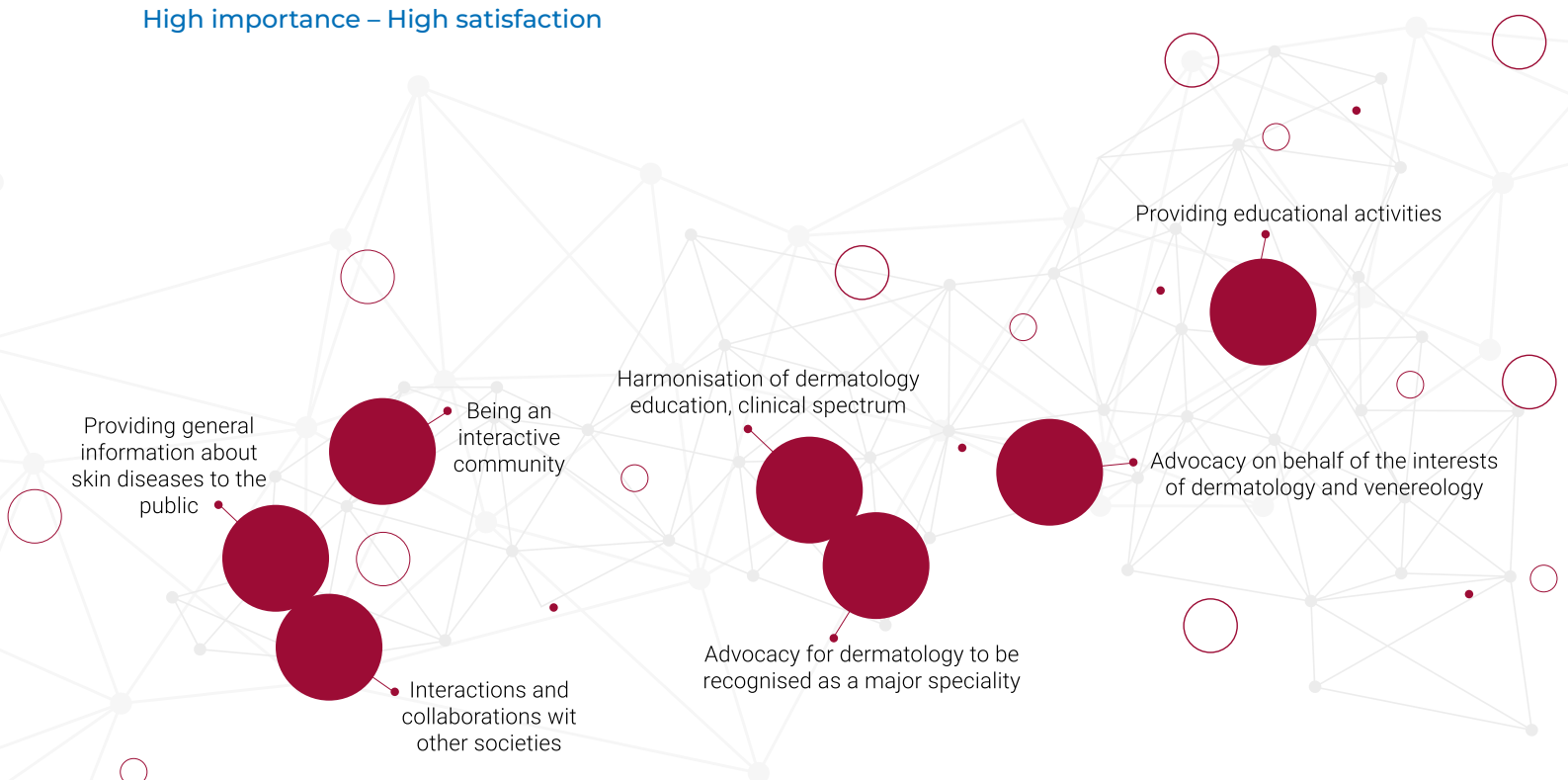

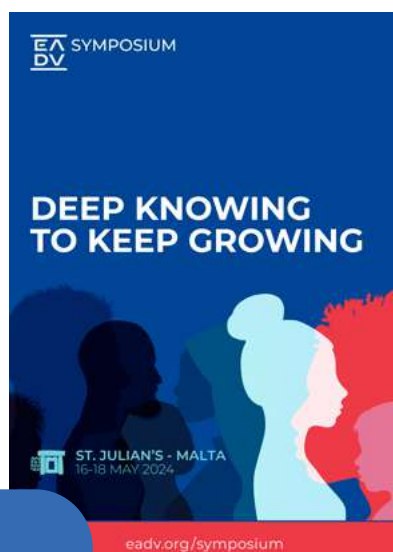

Mohs Micrographic Surgery (MMS) is a specialised technique for precisely removing skin cancer while preserving healthy tissue. Despite its effectiveness, MMS remains limited in Europe compared to the US and Australia. To address this, EADV offers a Mohs Fellowship to train more European Mohs surgeons, ensuring better skin cancer care. With one in three cancers being skin cancer, dermatologists must be at the forefront of advanced treatments. By expanding access to MMS, EADV aims to improve clinical outcomes and patient care across Europe.

Changes to the Journal have been implemented according to the JEADV strategy including:

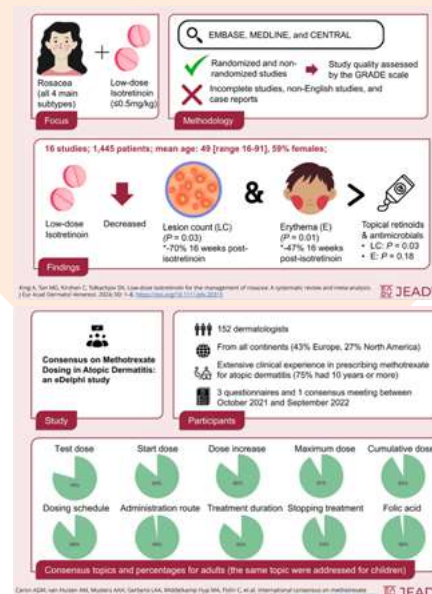
- Strengthening of the Editorial Team through the appointment of Senior Editors and leading experts across various disease areas.

4 We strive to openly address social and ethical issues that are relevant for patients, healthcare professionals and society at large.

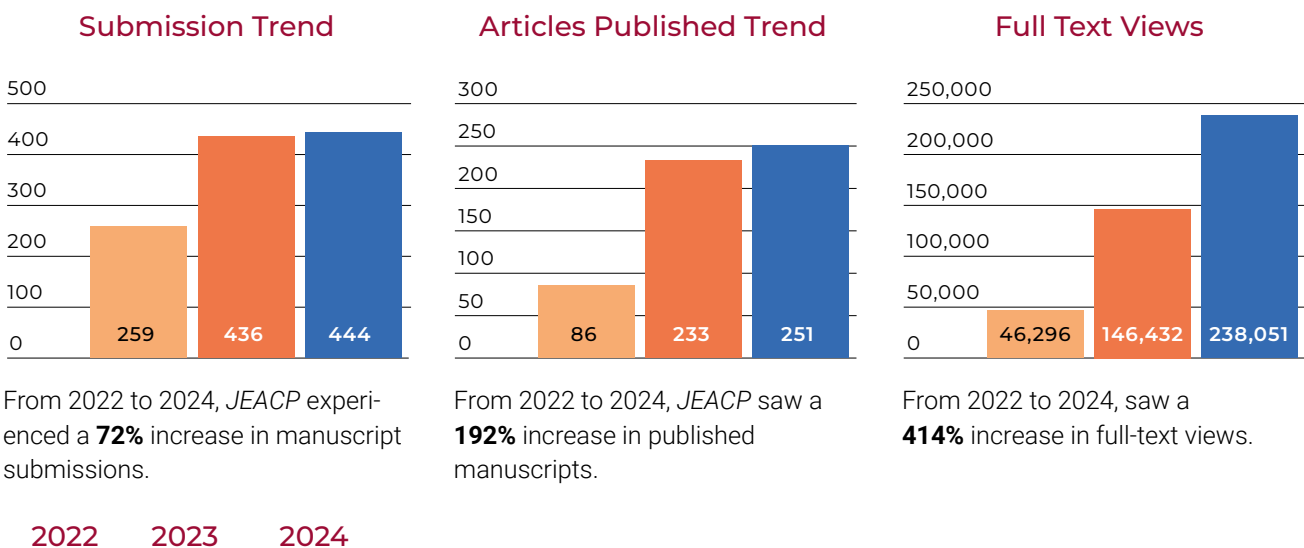

Website Statistics 2024



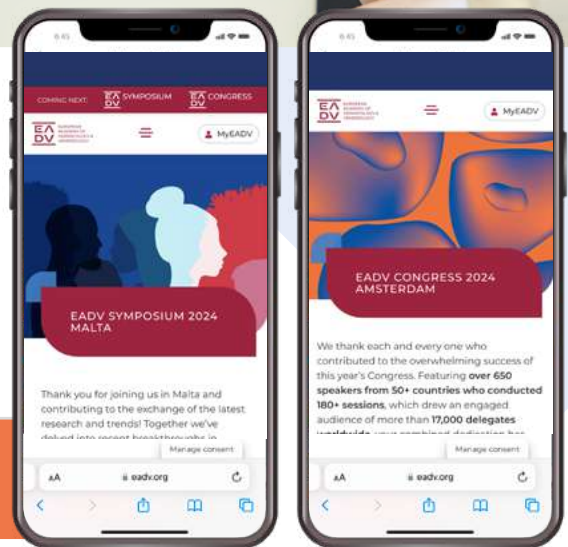

Website performance and user engagement

The **eadv.org website** achieved exceptional performance metrics in 2024, with total views reaching 1,921,824 - marking a **327% year-on-year increase**.

The **platform** also experienced a significant rise in unique users, totaling 438,974, reflecting a **238% growth**.

The successful integration of event-specific web pages into eadv.org facilitated a seamless user experience, streamlined information accessibility, and optimised engagement with key content. This strategic consolidation resulted in a marked increase in visits to corporate pages, effectively doubling overall traffic.

Task forces

The [EADV task forces](#) (TFs) are expert groups dedicated to advancing scientific, clinical and educational aspects of dermatovenereology. Acting as centres of excellence, they develop guidelines, educational initiatives and research projects while identifying unmet needs in the field. Reporting to the task force facilitator, these groups align with EADV's mission and drive innovation. EADV had 38 task forces in 2024, fostering collaboration among specialists and shaping our field through knowledge sharing, to secure scientific progress, clinical excellence and education within dermatology and venereology.

Unification of Advocacy Working Group and Patient Advocacy Task Force

The Advocacy Working Group and the Patient Advocacy Task Force officially merged during the year, marking a significant milestone in EADV's efforts to strengthen advocacy within dermatology and venereology. This unification brings together the expertise and resources of both groups, fostering a more cohesive and strategic approach to addressing patient needs, professional

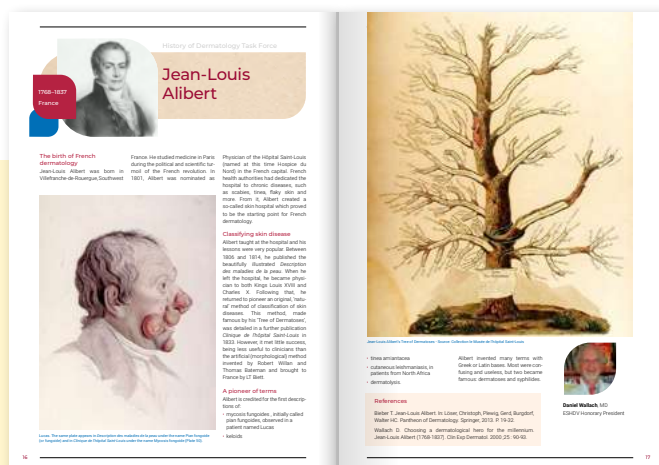

Advocacy

Advocacy Working Group

Two thousand and twenty four was a transition year for EU affairs, marked by the European elections, a political changeover, and the appointment of a new European Commission; shifts that have influenced EADV's advocacy strategy and engagement programme.

EADV's Advocacy Task Force is also in the process of transitioning from supporting the Executive Committee to working under the EADV office operational team to secure a more structured and sustainable approach.

During the year the Advocacy Task Force and Patient Task Force merged to foster a more unified approach.

Throughout the year, EADV pursued strategic advocacy initiatives that reinforce our role in shaping policies related to **dermatology, prevention and patient care**.

Key activities included:

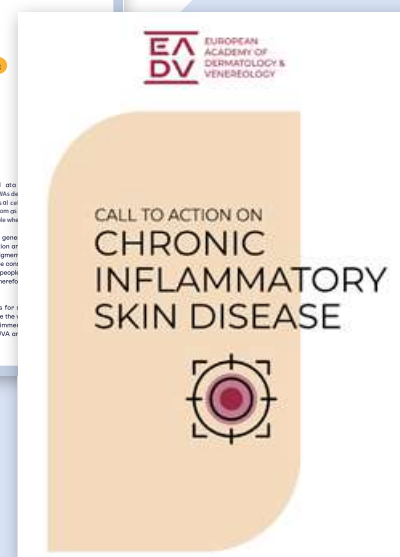
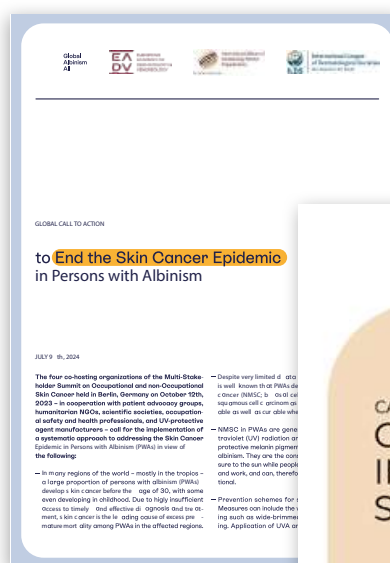
- **Global Call to Action to end skin cancer in people with albinism (PWAs)**, following the Multistakeholder Summit on Occupational and Non-Occupational Skin Cancer in Berlin in 2023. EADV and our partners urge policymakers, public health authorities and global stakeholders to implement a systematic approach to tackling skin cancer in PWAs, ensuring access to prevention measures, early diagnosis and adequate treatment.
- **Global Call to Action to protect outdoor workers from skin cancer caused by solar UV radiation**, shared with the European Cancer Organisation (ECO) for inclusion in its resources.
- **EADV Congress 2024 – Amsterdam (Netherlands)**: The annual EADV Congress served as a pivotal moment for advocacy, gathering experts, policymakers and patient representatives to drive forward dermatology-related policy discussions. The event reinforced the importance of EADV's Calls to Action and emphasised the need for stronger policy measures at both EU and national levels.
- **Engagement with EU Health Permanent Representations** through targeted letters, emphasising the substantial burden of inflammatory skin diseases and advocating for greater recognition of their connection to cardiovascular diseases.





Looking ahead, key advocacy initiatives are already in motion for early 2025:

- **European Parliament outreach:** EADV engaged with seven MEPs, who expressed strong interest in collaborating to advance key dermato-venereology priorities.
- **Strategy workshop:** A dedicated session was held to define EADV's renewed advocacy priorities, including:
 - Prevention, early detection and timely treatment of skin diseases
 - Regulation and awareness of sunbeds
 - Women's health
 - Additional topics for consideration are sexually transmitted infections (STIs), cardiovascular and mental health, rare diseases, AI and occupational skin diseases.
- **New advocacy strategy:** The updated strategy, outlining EADV's policy-shaping efforts and engagement plan, is expected to be finalised in Q1 2025.



Finances

As in previous years, in 2024, EADV was able to increase our membership and the number of participants at the Congress in Amsterdam, the Netherlands. The number of members reached a record high of 11,361.

The EADV 2024 Congress attracted about 17,500 participants and resulted in a financial success, with 20.8M euros revenue. The costs of organising this event have increased in line with the revenue increase. The financial results of the Spring Symposium (Malta continued to be challenging with a loss of 0.5M euros).

Extra income is primarily spent on public utility activities, such as research projects (€0.9M), development and education (€0.7M) and scholarships. In total 3.6M euros was spent in 2024 on medical training.

The investments that suffered from the financial and geopolitical turmoil in 2022, started recovering in 2023 (+4.96%) which continued in 2024 (+5.43%). The net financial results in 2024 after taxes improved by 0.4M euros compared to 2023. The budget for 2025 was presented to the EADV Board in September 2024 and approved.

The financial situation of EADV remains excellent with about 94% of assets represented by cash and investments. You will find attached the income statement and balance sheet, as of 31 December 2023 and 2024. EADV's finances have been audited by KPMG and showed no irregularities. The KPMG report was discussed by the Finance Committee and approved. Internal (financial) procedures are audited on a regular basis by an external expert (Udo Schiller Consulting).

The Treasurer operates in close contact with the Financial Director of EADV Mr Giovanni Berra, the Finance Committee and an investment advisor (Travella Partners). On an international level, the Treasurer participated in joint Treasurer's meetings with the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD), the International League of Dermatological Societies (ILDS) and the International Society of Dermatology (ISD) during the AAD San Diego meeting, the EADV Amsterdam Congress and the MEIDAM Congress in Dubai. Topics that were discussed related to investments, interaction with industry, strategic planning and governance.
