Description

The “Comprehensive Melanoma Management in Clinical Practice” course offers an update on the diagnostic and therapeutic approach to melanoma patients. From early diagnosis to surgical procedures for primary and advanced melanoma to the current use of systemic therapies, the integrated management of melanoma patients is discussed during this 3-day course held in a clinical dermatology department.

The programme includes

- Update sessions on diagnostic and therapeutic topics,
- Hands-on workshops on diagnostic procedures,
- Discussion sessions on clinical cases provided/presented by the participants.
- The course also aims at sharing the experiences of other centers in the management of melanoma patients.

Finally, participants will benefit from an outstanding networking opportunity with other European dermatologists dedicated to melanoma patients' management.

Learning Objectives

Following this course, the attendee should be able to:

- ✓ Identify the morphological, genetic, and molecular bases that, applied to clinical practice, help in early diagnosis of primary melanoma and tumour metastasis.
- ✓ Gain a thorough knowledge of the onco-pathological and immunopathological bases of each of the diagnostic and therapeutic options available for melanoma patients care.
- ✓ Become familiar with the diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, both medical and surgical, currently available in clinical practice for the management of any clinical settings in melanoma patients.
- ✓ Transfer to clinical practice the knowledge acquired on early diagnosis, and medical and surgical treatment of melanoma patients.
- ✓ Make therapeutic decisions in challenging clinical situations by integrating the available therapeutic procedures and after an adequate assessment of the risks and benefits of each of the options.
