Dear Colleagues and Friends,

On behalf of the Scientific Programming Committee, it is my pleasure to welcome you to the 2026 EADV Symposium in Athens, Greece.

This year's scientific programme will highlight the most recent advances in dermatology across a wide range of clinical areas, featuring more than 25 sessions and over 100 distinguished speakers. The opening day will include two keynote lectures: "From novel mechanisms of ageing to new therapeutic interventions" presented by Nektarios Tavernarakis, Professor of Molecular Systems Biology at the Medical School of the University of Crete, and "Beauty and dermatology practices in Ancient Greece" presented by Lydia Trakatelli, from the Acropolis Museum in Athens.

Authors who submitted highest rated abstracts will have the opportunity to present their work during the Free Communications sessions.

Scientific Programme

The scientific programme is organised on full or half-day tracks; each track has a specific topic and a structured programme.

Session types

Sessions of different formats will cover the important fields of dermatology and venereology. Subjects will be treated with different approaches and from different perspectives. The following session tracks will be scheduled throughout the duration of the Symposium and are available to all registered participants.

- Plenary sessions:** Plenary lectures are EADV showcase sessions and include keynote lectures delivered by eminent scientists and doctors.
- Focus on:** These sessions aim to provide comprehensive, in-depth coverage of a specific dermatology topic. The talks will be included in sessions on pathophysiology / epidemiology, clinical challenges, or practical aspects of disease management and will provide the latest cutting-edge information.
- What's new:** These sessions will enable participants to update their knowledge on a specific topic and hear about the most relevant and recent developments, guidelines and practical knowledge from the past year. The talks will summarise the current understanding of the subject, followed by an update on the most recent novelties with their impact on clinical practice.
- Interactive clinical cases:** These lectures focus on a specific disease and include basic information about epidemiology, pathophysiology, diagnosis, management and prognosis. The target audience of these sessions is young dermatology trainees and residents, as well as dermatologists who want to refresh their basic knowledge on specific topics. The topic of each presentation should be developed from clinical cases and include clinical photographs. The main objective is to provide the audience clues for differential diagnosis and disease management in their daily practice. Each presentation is supposed to be interactive, with multiple-choice question made to the audience in accordance with the subjects treated in the talks. Each speaker will be asked to include 2-3 questions by "data" along with the different answers' options.
- Free communications:** Authors of the most highly-ranked abstracts assessed by a selected panel of abstract reviewers are invited to provide a 10-minute oral presentation.

Healthcare Professional information and definition

1. Important note to Healthcare and Non-Healthcare Professionals

Access to the different areas and sessions of the Symposium is determined by the attendee's Healthcare Professional status.

As a multidisciplinary audience will attend the EADV Congress, the EADV will assign different classes to Healthcare Professionals (HCPs) and Non-Healthcare Professionals (non-HCPs) to ensure compliance with the Hellenic Association of Pharmaceutical Companies (SFEE's Promotion Code) ([CODE OF ETHICS & PARTNERSHIPS | SFEE](#)).

Please read the description below to ensure that you (or your delegates) comply with the regulations in place.

EADV members are not automatically considered Healthcare Professionals.

Please select the correct status (HCP or non-HCP) during registration.

2. HCP Definition

The SFEE code defines Healthcare Professionals as follows (Definitions, page 6): *"any natural person who is identified as a healthcare professional in the applicable legislation¹ and whose primary practice or principal professional address is in Greece and who, in the course of his/her professional activities, may prescribe, purchase, supply, recommend or administer medicinal products.*

It is explicitly clarified that the very broad subset of Healthcare Professionals who are not legally entitled to prescribe, supply or administer medicinal products, but nevertheless belong to the category of Healthcare Professionals, are not considered as the general public. In this sense, product promotions at scientific event venues where such persons may be present are not prohibited.

In the context of the national cancer policy, the speciality of pathologists is also explicitly included in this definition.

To avoid any doubt, the term "Healthcare Professional", with the exception of Chapter 1 hereof, also includes:

- a. *any official or employee of a government agency or other organisation (whether in the public or private sector) who may prescribe, purchase, supply, recommend or administer Medicinal Products; and*
- b. *any employee of a Pharmaceutical Company whose primary occupation is that of a practising HCP (e.g. medical doctor, nurse, dentist, etc.).*

However, the definition excludes:

- i. *all other full-term personnel (whether HCPs or not) of a PC under an employment contract, professional service contract or independent work contract; and*
- ii. *wholesalers or distributors of Medicinal Products."*





Article 4 of Law 4238/GG A, 38/17.02.2014, characterises the following persons as Healthcare Professionals (HCPs): family physicians and physicians of other specialties, dentists and other healthcare professionals such as midwives, health visitors, nurses, social workers, physiotherapists, dietitians/nutritionists, psychologists, occupational therapists, medical laboratory technologists, medical and biological laboratory assistants, medical equipment operators.

→ **Medical students** are not considered Healthcare Professionals under the current guidelines and will be automatically classified as Non-Healthcare Professionals.

3. Industry sessions

Satellite Symposia presenting data on the development, research, or other issues related to prescription medicine is restricted to Professionals and Non-Member (INDUSTRY) as indicated by the Industry Session Organiser.

All promotional materials and marketing aids related to these industry sessions should be strictly limited to HCPs.

Industry Session organisers can limit participation to certain representative groups independently from the EADV recommendations if deemed imperative to achieving the session's intended purpose. The organising company reserves the right to refuse single categories, particularly if they are not adequately related to the session's objective and purpose.


