

Cutaneous Lymphoma

Residents Only Course | 22-24 March 2027 | Bordeaux, France

Description

This face-to-face course will provide a practical overview of cutaneous lymphoma including diagnostic criteria, staging adapted to the type of lymphoma, and treatment options. We will present and illustrate the clinical reasoning skills necessary for the optimal management, with personalized strategy for patients with cutaneous lymphomas, at various stages of the diseases. Recent data concerning new entities, new therapies and guidelines, translational research, and international prospective prognostic studies will be presented.

The course will combine classical presentations and interactive sessions with slide analysis, case-based diagnostic and therapeutic discussions. Residents will also be invited to present cases for discussion with the faculty members.

Learning Objectives

1. Learn which investigations are useful for diagnosis and initial work-up, depending on the type of cutaneous lymphoma clinically suspected.
2. Understand the therapeutic strategy for cutaneous lymphoma and learn when innovative treatments should be used
3. Become familiar with the evolution and prognostic factors of cutaneous lymphoma according to subtype.
4. Know how to consider the patients' quality of life and psychological impact of the lymphoma, learn how to explain the disease and the treatments
