

Treatment of Common Skin Diseases in Children

Combined Course (Residents and Specialists) | 18-19 February 2027 | Bucharest, Romania

Description

Case-based scenarios of skin disorders in children and adolescents will be utilized to review the differential diagnosis of skin findings in this population and to discuss approaches for evaluation and management of these disorders.

These will include discussions on laboratory testing strategies, provide updates from recent medical literature, and offer clinically useful practice "pearls".

The topics explored will be representative for inflammatory, infectious, neoplastic, and genetic skin diseases areas.

1. Diagnose and manage common pediatric skin disease in outpatient and inpatient settings.
2. Recognize classic presentations of rare disorders and unusual presentations of common disorders.
3. Strategies for management of the common and uncommon clinical forms of the frequent dermatologic disease in children.
4. Develop communication skills with children and their families.
5. Utilize laboratory testing when appropriate to diagnose pediatric dermatologic disorders.
6. Apply knowledge from clinical pearls to the diagnosis and management of pediatric skin disease.
